Holy Communion is celebrated today.

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) Under the provincial health guidelines we are allowed to have 25% capacity (55 people) at St. Matthew's. The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the service. There will be one service at St. Matthew's: 9:30 A.M. (MB).

Divine Service at Grace is limited to 30% (30 persons plus pastor and organist). The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the service.

Pre-registration is required for all services (by Saturday noon MB time please).

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER APOLOGY OF THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION ARTICLE V, LOVE AND FULFILLING THE LAW

The Church Fathers have clearly handed down the doctrine that we need mercy even in good works.

Scripture teaches the same. "Enter not into judgment with Your servant, for no one living is righteous before You" (Psalm 143:2). This passage denies absolutely—even to all saints and servants of God—the glory of righteousness, if God does not forgive, but judges and convicts their hearts. For when David boasts about his righteousness, he speaks about his own cause against the persecutors of God's Word. He does not speak of his personal purity. He asks that God's cause and glory be defended, "Judge me, O Lord, according to my righteousness and according to the integrity that is in me" (Psalm 7:8) Likewise, in Psalm 130:3, he says that no one can endure God's judgment:

"If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities,

O Lord, who could stand?"

If I wash myself with snow and cleanse my hands with lye, yet You will plunge me into a pit. (Job 9:30–31)

Who can say, "I have made my heart pure;

I am clean from my sin"? (Proverbs 20:9)

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves,

and the truth is not in us. (1 John 1:8)

In the Lord's Prayer the saints ask for the forgiveness of

sins. Even the saints have sins.


Highway #5, at Park Stree Evangelical=Lutheran Congregatior St. Matthew'
