The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) We give thanks to God that in-person Divine Service has resumed. Under the respective provincial health guidelines we are allowed to have up to 58 people (30% capacity and is dependent on seating configuration from pre-registration*) at St. Matthew's (9:30 A.M. MB) and up to 30 people (30% capacity) at Grace (10:30 A.M. SK).

Pre-registration is requested (by Friday afternoon please – If you forget, please message when you remember).

* Preregistration last week at St. Matthew's was 52 (3 were unable to attend). That left pew 1 open, and that would only have allowed 4 people or one larger family group in the sanctuary.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST LARGE CATECHISM, THE EIGHTH COMMANDMENT

You can learn from the daily government of the household. When the master of the house sees that the servant does not do what he ought, he admonishes him personally. But if he were so foolish as to let the servant sit at home and went on the streets to complain about him to his neighbors, he would no doubt be told, "You fool, how does that concern us? Why don't you tell it to the servant?" That would be brotherly, the evil would be stopped, and your neighbor would retain his honor. Christ says, "If he listens to you, you have gained your brother." For do you think it is a small matter to gain a brother?

Christ teaches, "But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses". So the person must always be dealt with personally, and must not be spoken of without his knowledge. But if that does not work, then bring it publicly before the community, whether before the civil or the Church court. For then you do not stand alone, but you have those witnesses with you by whom you can convict the guilty one. Relying on their testimony the judge can pronounce sentence and punish. This is the right course for reforming a wicked person. But if we gossip about another no one will be reformed. If you were acting for your neighbor's reformation or from love of the truth, you would not sneak about secretly. (paragraphs 277-281, 283)


