## Holy Communion is celebrated today.

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is

present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1 ESV)

Under the new health orders St. Matthew's is limited to 150 or 50% capacity whichever is greater (approximately 68 persons depending on seating).

The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the services at St. Matthew's.

# Pre-registration is required (by Saturday noon MB time please).

Changes to our procedures/practice will be discussed after service today at St. Matthew's (see below).

Divine Service at Grace:

The use of non-medical masks is optional at Grace. In Christian freedom please continue to respect others' desire for physical distancing when entering/exiting and being seated.

Be mindful that not all may be vaccinated or fully vaccinated. It is still possible for fully vaccinated individuals to contract Covid-19 and also transmit it to others.

If you would like a large print bulletin and/or a large print order of service (complete with hymns), please let Pastor Wood know. This is already being done for several members.

## A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST FORMULA OF CONCORD, SOLID DECLARATION ARTICLE II, FREE WILL

#### [NEGATIVE STATEMENTS]

We reject the following teaching of the popes and monks: after regeneration a person can completely fulfill God's Law in this life, and through this fulfillment of the Law he is righteous before God and merits eternal life.

On the other hand, the enthusiasts should be rebuked with great seriousness and zeal. They should not be tolerated in any way in God's Church. They imagine that God, without any means, without the hearing of the divine Word, and without the use of the holy Sacraments, draws people to Himself, enlightens, justifies, and saves them.

We should also rebuke those who imagine that in conversion and regeneration God creates a new heart and new person in such a way that the substance and essence of the old Adam, and especially the rational soul, are completely destroyed, and a new essence of the soul is created out of nothing. St. Augustine clearly rebukes this error in (his comments on) Psalm 25, where he quotes the passage from Paul [in Ephesians 4:22], "Put off your old self ..." Augustine explains this in the following words:

Lest anyone might think that the essence of a person is to be laid aside, he explains what it is to lay aside the old man, and to put on the new, when he says: "Putting away lying, speak the truth." (paragraphs 79-81)


