The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is

present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

St. Matthew's is limited to approximately 68 persons depending on seating.

We are NOT requiring a proof of vaccination to attend service. The use of at minimum non-medical masks is required.

Pre-registration is requested/required because of seating limitations to ensure you have a place. (by Saturday noon MB time please).

Divine Service at Grace: The use of at minimum non-medical masks is required.

In Christian freedom please continue to respect others' desire for physical distancing when entering/exiting and being seated. Be mindful that not all may be vaccinated or fully vaccinated.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD THIRD SUNDAY IN ADVENT APOLOGY OF THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION ARTICLE V, LOVE AND FULFILLING OF THE LAW

Clear testimonies in Scripture and in the Church Fathers declare that, even though we have good works, yet in these very works we need mercy. Faith, looking upon this mercy, cheers and consoles us. The adversaries are wrong when they praise merits and add nothing about this faith that takes hold of mercy. The promise [of mercy] is grasped only through faith. We justly find fault with the doctrine about wholly deserving merit, since it omits justifying faith. It also hides Christ's glory and office as Mediator. We are not teaching anything new. The Church Fathers have handed down the doctrine that we need mercy even in good works.

Scripture teaches the same. "Enter not into judgment with Your servant, for no one living is righteous before You" (Psalm 143:2). This denies absolutely the glory of righteousness, if God does not forgive, but judges and convicts their hearts. For when David boasts in other places about his righteousness, he speaks about his own cause against the persecutors of God's Word. He does not speak of his personal purity. He asks that God's cause and glory be defended; "Judge me, O Lord, according to my righteousness and according to the integrity that is in me" (Psalm 7:8). In Psalm 130:3, he says that no one can endure God's judgment: "If You, O Lord, should mark iniquities, O Lord, who could stand?" (paragraphs 202-205)


