The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself.

Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

communion and worship attendance in the narthex. Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT FORMULA OF CONCORD, EPITOME ARTICLE V, THE LAW AND THE GOSPEL

The Pure Doctrine of God's Word

We believe, teach, and confess that the distinction between the Law and the Gospel is to be kept in the Church with great diligence as a particularly brilliant light. By this distinction, according to the admonition of St. Paul, God's Word is rightly divided.

We believe that the Law is properly a divine doctrine. It teaches what is right and pleasing to God, and it rebukes everything that is sin and contrary to God's will.

For this reason, then, everything that rebukes sin is, and belongs to, the preaching of the Law.

But the Gospel is properly the kind of teaching that shows what a person who has not kept the Law (and therefore is condemned by it) is to believe. It teaches that Christ has paid for and made satisfaction for all sins [Romans 5:9]. Christ has gained and acquired for an individual—without any of his own merit—forgiveness of sins, righteousness that avails before God, and eternal life [Romans 5:10].

The term *Gospel* is not used in one and the same sense in the Holy Scriptures. The term *Gospel* [sometimes means] Christ's entire teaching (this is how it is used in Mark 1:15; Acts 20:21). It is correctly said that the Gospel is a preaching of repentance and of the forgiveness of sins. (paragraphs 2-6)


