The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and

have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

Divine Services are suspended at St. Matthew's until further notice (at least February 12th). Sunday service will be live streamed at 11:30 A.M. on Facebook and posted on our YouTube channel (Roblin Zorra Lutheran Parish) by 3:00 P.M.

All other activities at St. Matthew's are also suspended.

Divine Service at Grace is limited to 30 person (plus pastor and organist). The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the service. Pre-registration is requested.

The Theme for the 2021 Lenten Midweek Services is "Four Significant Days." Many Christians are well aware of what took place on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. But what took place on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of Holy Week? These three days contain some of Jesus' most significant action, most significant teaching, and most significant confrontation with the religious leaders of his day. Following Ash Wednesday, a significant day in its own right, the other five midweek services of this series will explore the "Significant Days" between Palm Sunday and Maundy Thursday. Our Lenten journey begins with Ash Wednesday (February 17th). It is yet to be determined whether he services will be in-person, recorded, or live-streamed only.

Jesus surpasses all expectations as we see Him revealed on the Mount of Transfiguration. Hear the message by Guest Speaker: Rev. A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY POWER AND PRIMACY OF THE POPE

Christ gave the apostles only spiritual power (i.e., the command to teach the Gospel, to announce the forgiveness of sins, to administer the Sacraments, to excommunicate the godless without bodily force (by the Word)). He did not give them the power of the sword. For Christ says, "Go ... teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19–20). Also, "As the Father has sent Me, even so I am sending you" (John 20:21).

It is clear that Christ was not sent to bear the sword or possess a worldly kingdom, as He Himself says, "My kingdom is not of this world" (John 18:36).

[A Contrast between Christ and the Pope]

Christ in His passion is crowned with thorns and led forth to be ridiculed in royal purple. This symbolizes that in the future, after His spiritual kingdom was despised (i.e., the Gospel was suppressed), another kingdom of a worldly kind would be set up with the appearance of churchly power. (So the Constitution of Boniface VIII and similar opinions are false and godless, for they argue that the pope is by divine right the ruler of the kingdoms of the world.) From this notion, horrible darkness has been brought into the Church. The ministry of the Gospel was neglected and knowledge of faith and the spiritual kingdom became extinct. Christian righteousness was assumed to be the outward government the pope had established. (paragraphs 31-34)


