#### **Holy Communion is celebrated today**.

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is

present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

St. Matthew's is limited to two groups of 25 people/service (one cohort in sanctuary/one cohort in the basement) until at least January 11, 2022

Because intermingling is not to take place,

Holy Communion will be brought to the basement attendees
Divine Service at 11:30 A.M. in-person and livestreamed
Divine Service at 1:00 P.M. in-person only (if necessary)
We are NOT requiring a proof of vaccination to attend service.

The use of at minimum non-medical masks is required.

Pre-registration is required because of seating limitations to ensure you have a place. (by Saturday noon MB time please).

Divine Service at Grace:

The use of at minimum non-medical masks is required.

In Christian freedom please continue to respect others' desire for physical distancing when entering/exiting and being seated.

Be mindful that not all may be vaccinated or fully vaccinated.

#### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

SECOND SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY FORMULA OF CONCORD, SOLID DECLARATION ARTICLE VIII, THE PERSON OF CHRIST

[Jesus] did all His miracles by the power of this personal union. He showed His divine majesty, according to His pleasure, when and as He willed. He did this not just after His resurrection and ascension, but also in His state of humiliation. For example:

- (a) At the wedding at Cana of Galilee
- (b) When He was twelve years old, among the learned
- (c) In the garden, when with a word He cast His enemies to the ground
- (d) In death, when He died not simply as any other man, but in and with His death conquered sin, death, devil, hell, and eternal damnation

The human nature alone would not have been able to do these miracles if it had not been personally united and had communion with the divine nature.

The human nature, after the resurrection, is exalted above all creatures in heaven and on earth. This is nothing other than that He entirely laid aside the form of a servant. He has the full possession and use of the divine majesty according to His received human nature. However, He had this majesty immediately at His conception, even in His mother's womb. As the apostle testifies, He laid it aside. Luther explains, He kept it concealed in the state of His humiliation and did not always use it, but only when He wanted to use it. (pars 25-26)


