The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is

present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Please mark the registration sheet for communion and worship attendance in the narthex. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews. Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

Quilting continues at St. Matthew's Monday's at 1:00 P.M.


Junior Confirmation resumes this week.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY FORMULA OF CONCORD, SOLID DECLARATION ARTICLE XI: ETERNAL ELECTION

The entire Holy Trinity—God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—directs all people to Christ, as to the Book of Life. For this has been decided by the Father from eternity: whom He would save He would save through Christ. Christ Himself says, "No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). And again, "I am the door. If anyone enters by Me, he will be saved" (John 10:9).

Christ, as God's only-begotten Son, who is in the bosom of the Father [John 1:18], has announced the Father's will to us. He says, "For this is the will of My Father, that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in Him should have eternal life" (John 6:40). And again, "God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

The Father wants all people to hear this proclamation and desires that they come to Christ. Christ does not drive these people from Him, as it is written, "whoever comes to Me I will never cast out" (John 6:37).

In order that we may come to Christ, the Holy Spirit works true faith through the hearing of the Word. The apostle testifies about this when he says, "faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ" (Romans 10:17), that is, when it is preached in its truth and purity. (paragraphs 66-69)
