The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted people Jesus Christ is present in the

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded. Flowers on the altar at St. Matthew's are placed by Emil Schmollinger in loving memory of his wife, Hertha.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) We give thanks to God that in-person Divine Service has resumed. Under the respective provincial health guidelines we are allowed to have up to 50 people at St. Matthew's (9:30 A.M. MB) and up to 30 people at Grace (10:30 A.M. SK).

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST APOLOGY OF THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION ARTICLES VII AND VIII, THE CHURCH

The Church is Christ's kingdom, distinguished from the devil's kingdom. It is certain, however, that the wicked are in the devil's power and members of his kingdom. Christ says to the Pharisees, who certainly had outward fellowship with the Church, "You are of your father the devil" (John 8:44). Therefore, the Church, which is truly Christ's kingdom, is properly the congregation of saints. For the wicked are ruled by the devil and are captives of the devil. They are not ruled by the Spirit of Christ.

If the Church, which is truly Christ's kingdom, is distinguished from the devil's kingdom, it follows that the wicked are not the Church. It is true that, because Christ's kingdom has not yet been revealed, the wicked are mixed in with the Church and hold offices. But the wicked are not Christ's kingdom, even though that revelation has not yet been made. For Christ enlivens His true kingdom by His Spirit, whether it is revealed or is covered by the cross, just as the glorified Christ is the same Christ who was afflicted. Christ's parables agree with this. "The good seed is the children of the kingdom. The weeds are the sons of the evil one" (Matthew 13:38). "The field," He says, "is the world," not the Church. John the Baptist speaks about the Jewish people and says that eventually the true Church will be separated from that people. (paragraphs 16-19)
