

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!"" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) Under the new health orders St. Matthew's is limited to 50% capacity up to 150 persons (approximately 68 persons depending on seating).

We will have one service at 9:30 A.M. The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the services at St. Matthew's.

Pre-registration is required (by Saturday noon MB time please).

Divine Service at Grace:

The use of non-medical masks is optional at Grace. In Christian freedom please continue to respect others' desire for physical distancing when entering/exiting and being seated.

Be mindful that not all may be vaccinated or fully vaccinated. It is still possible for fully vaccinated individuals to contract Covid-19 and also transmit it to others.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST APOLOGY OF THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION ARTICLE XIIB, CONFESSION AND SATISFACTION

Confession is mentioned at different times in the Psalms. "I will confess my transgressions to the Lord,' and You forgave the iniquity of my sin" (32:5). Such confession of sin, which is made to God, is contrition itself. When confession is made to God it must be made with the heart, not only with the voice. Confession is contrition in which, feeling God's anger, we confess that God is justly angry and that He cannot be reconciled by our works. Yet, we seek for mercy because of God's promise. Such is the following confession, "Against You, You only, have I sinned … so that You may be justified in Your words and blameless in Your judgment" (Psalm 51:4). This means, "I confess that I am a sinner and have merited eternal wrath. Nor can I set my righteousnesses, my merits, against Your wrath. So I declare that You are just when You condemn and punish us. I declare that You are clear when hypocrites judge You to be unjust in punishing them or in condemning the well-deserving. Yes, our merits cannot satisfy Your judgment. But we will be justified if You justify us, if through Your mercy You count us righteous." Perhaps someone may also cite James 5:16, "Confess your sins to one another." But here the reference is not to confession made to priests, but is the reconciliation of brothers to each other. Confession should be mutual. (paragraphs 10-12)


