The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is

present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

Under the new health orders St. Matthew's is limited to 50% capacity up to 150 persons (approximately 68 persons depending on seating).

We will have one service at 9:30 A.M. The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the services at St. Matthew's.

Pre-registration is required (by Saturday noon MB time please).

Divine Service at Grace:

The use of non-medical masks is optional at Grace. In Christian freedom please continue to respect others' desire for physical distancing when entering/exiting and being seated.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

NINTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST APOLOGY OF THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION ARTICLE IV, JUSTIFICATION

Because faith receives forgiveness of sins and reconciles us to God, we are (like Abraham) counted as righteous for Christ's sake before we love and do the works of the Law.

This faith alone receives forgiveness of sins, makes us acceptable to God, and brings the Holy Spirit. It could be called "grace making one pleasing to God".

We receive forgiveness of sins for Christ's sake through faith alone. We are justified, that is, unrighteous people are made righteous. The knowledge of this faith is necessary. Because Christ's office is recognized in this alone, we receive Christ's benefits by this alone. Only this teaching brings sure and firm consolation to pious minds. In the Church there must be the teaching by which the pious may receive the sure hope of salvation. For the adversaries give people bad advice when they tell them to doubt whether they receive forgiveness of sins. How will such persons sustain themselves in death who have heard nothing of this faith and think that they ought to doubt whether they receive forgiveness of sins? The promise is that sins are freely forgiven for Christ's sake. Those who teach nothing of this faith we speak about, completely abolish the Gospel. Our adversaries reject this faith. By rejecting this faith they abolish the entire promise about the free forgiveness of sins and the righteousness of Christ. (paragraphs 114, 116-121)


