#### Holy Communion is celebrated today.

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) We give thanks to God that in-person Divine Service has resumed. Under

the respective provincial health guidelines we are allowed to have up to 50 people at St. Matthew's (9:30 A.M. MB) and up to 30 people at Grace (10:30 A.M. SK).

It pleased almighty God to call out of this life the soul of Ruth Zimmer (wife of Julius) on Tuesday, March 31<sup>st</sup>. The interment took place on April 6<sup>th</sup>. #### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD **EIGHTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST** PREFACE TO THE CHRISTIAN BOOK OF CONCORD

Being instructed from the prophetic and apostolic Scriptures, we are sure about our doctrine and Confession. By the grace of the Holy Spirit, our minds have been confirmed. Therefore, this Book of Concord should be published. It is necessary that, amid so many errors in our times, as well as causes of offense, there should exist a godly explanation about all these controversies. It should be derived from God's Word by which pure doctrine might be distinguished from the false. This matter is important. There are contentious people not bound to any formula of the pure doctrine. They stir up controversies, according to their good pleasure. The result is that the pure doctrine is hidden and lost. Then nothing is passed on to future generations except academic opinions. We owe our subjects this service: we should diligently care for the things that apply to this life and the life to come. We should take pains, with our utmost ability, to attend to those matters that promote (a) the extension of God's name and glory; (b) the spread of His Word (from which alone we hope for salvation); (c) the peace and tranquility of churches and schools; and (d) the instruction and consolation of disturbed consciences. We must do this. For it is a fact that this work of Christian concord has already been longed for and expected with anxious prayers and the greatest desire by many good and sincere people.


Highway #5, at Park Street **Roblin, Manitoba** Evangelical=Lutheran Congregatior St. Matthew'
