The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather. it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

Next Sunday is Food Bank Sunday and LWMLC Mite Box Sunday at St. Matthew's.

Bible Study may resume in person in the next few weeks. Alternatives are via electronic means. If you are interested, please talk to Pastor Wood.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) We give thanks to God that in-person Divine Service has resumed. As of June 21st in Manitoba we are allowed to have up to 30% capacity at St. Matthew's up to a maximum of 50 people. Up to 30 people are allowed at Grace.

Beginning today: St. Matthew's will have one service at 9:30 A.M. (MB) with 50 person limit. This service will also be live-streamed. Divine Service resumes at Grace (for the first time in 15 weeks) at 10:30 A.M. (SK) with 30 person limit. SDG (Soli Deo Gloria, not Social Distancing Guidelines).

You will still be needing to pre-register.

Our Easter Celebration service will be Sunday, July 12th (3 months late – but we are Easter people!).

A big thank you needs to be extended to Concordia Publishing House for the use of Lutheran Service Builder and the free license (which ends June 30). Lutheran Service Builder has allowed us to legally livestream the service with the hymns and to post the order of service on our parish website. The cost is \$425 USD for the first year and \$175 after the first year, plus \$75 USD/year for the hymn license for the parish. It is hoped that we may be able to continue to use this for our livestreaming ministry (this was not budgeted but special offerings for this would be welcomed). A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST FORMULA OF CONCORD, SOLID DECLARATION ARTICLE VIII, THE PERSON OF CHRIST

[Christ's] human nature, after the resurrection from the dead, is exalted above all creatures in heaven and on earth. He entirely laid aside the form of a servant. He did not lay aside His human nature, but retains it to eternity. He has the full possession and use of the divine majesty according to His received human nature. However, He had this majesty immediately at His conception, even in His mother's womb. As the apostle testifies, He laid it aside. As Dr. Luther explains, He kept it concealed in the state of His humiliation and did not always use it, but only when He wanted to use it.

Now He has ascended to heaven, not merely as any other saint, but as the apostle testifies, above all heavens. He also truly fills all things, being present everywhere, not only as God, but also as man. He rules from sea to sea and to the ends of the earth, as the prophets predict [Zechariah 9:10] and the apostles testify. He did this everywhere with them and confirmed their word with signs. This did not happen in an earthly way. As Dr. Luther explains, this happened according to the way things are done at God's right hand. "God's right hand" is no set place in heaven. It is nothing other than God's almighty power, which fills heaven and earth. Christ is installed according to His humanity, without confusing or equalizing the two natures in their essence and essential properties. (paragraphs 26-28)
