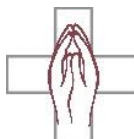

Holy Communion is celebrated today.

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews. Also the use of the common cup will be suspended for the time being.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

The church bell has been rung almost every noon since April 3 as a call for people to pause, pray the Lord’s prayer or other prayers, during this pandemic.

Bible Study may resume in person in the next few weeks. Alternatives are via electronic means. If you are interested, please talk to Pastor Wood.

A big thank you needs to be extended to Concordia Publishing House for the use of Lutheran Service Builder and the free license (which ends June 30). Lutheran Service Builder has allowed us to legally livestream the service with the hymns and to post the order of service on our parish website. The cost is \$425 for the first year and \$175 after the first year, plus \$75/year for the hymn license for the parish. It is hoped that we may be able to continue to use this for our livestreaming ministry (this was not budgeted but special offerings for this would be welcomed). “I was glad when they said to me, ‘Let us go to the house of the LORD!’” (Psalm 122:1 ESV) **We give thanks to God that in person Divine Service** has resumed with some modifications. If our numbers in Manitoba remain low phase 3 of the reopening plan may allow for 50% capacity in our services. SDG (Soli Deo Gloria, not Social Distancing Guidelines). It is hoped that Grace, Zorra may reopen soon. When both congregations are open we will have our Easter Celebration service on a “little Easter” Sunday.

Pastor Wood will make himself available in the chancel at the front of the church for private confession and absolution, prayer and Holy Communion during those hours. **Please call Pastor Wood on his cell phone to advise when you would like to come or to arrange a time outside of those set hours.** We want to limit the number of people in the sanctuary.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

HOLY TRINITY

LARGE CATECHISM, PART II, APOSTLES CREED

The Creed sets forth to us everything that we must expect and receive from God. The Creed teaches us to know Him fully [Ephesians 3:19]. This is intended to help us do what we ought to do according to the Ten Commandments. For the Ten Commandments are set so high that all human ability is far too feeble and weak to keep them. Therefore, it is just as necessary to learn this part of Christian doctrine as to learn the former. Then we may know how to attain what they command, both where and how to receive such power. For if we could by our own powers keep the Ten Commandments as they should be kept, we would need nothing further, neither the Creed nor the Lord's Prayer...

To make the Creed clearly understood as it is to be taught to children, we shall briefly sum up the entire Creed in three chief articles, according to the three persons in the Godhead [Col. 2:9]. Everything that we believe is related to these three persons. So the First Article, about God the Father, explains creation. The Second Article, about the Son, explains redemption. And the Third, about the Holy Spirit, explains sanctification. We present them as though the Creed were briefly summarized in so many words: I believe in God the Father, who has created me; I believe in God the Son, who has redeemed me; I believe in the Holy Spirit, who sanctifies me. One God and one faith, but three persons. Therefore, three articles or confessions. (paragraphs 1-3, 6-7)

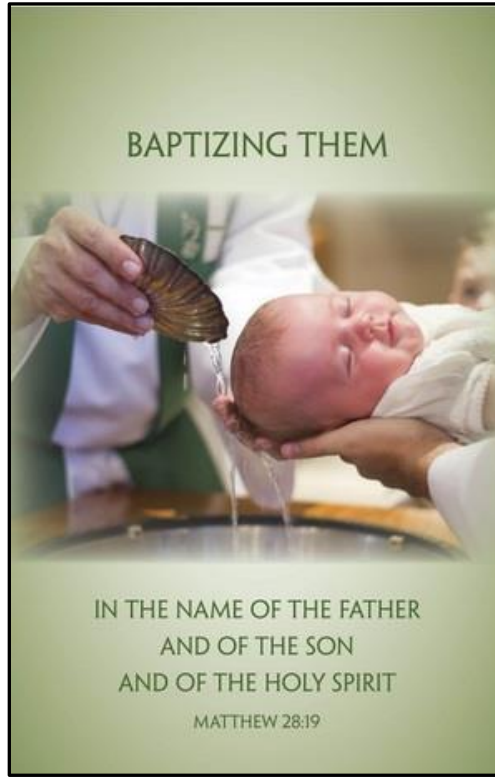
