The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

The Theme for the 2021 Lenten Midweek Services is "Four Significant Days." Our Lenten journey continues on Wednesday at St. Matthew's at 7:30 P.M. (MB) and will also be live-streamed. Pre-registration, non-medical masks etc. will be required. All other Covid-19 precautions will be observed.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) Under the provincial health guidelines we are allowed to have 25% capacity (55 people) at St. Matthew's. The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the service. There will be one service at St. Matthew's: 9:30 A.M. (MB). A second service at 1:15 P.M. (MB) will be added if needed.

Divine Service at Grace is limited to 30 person (plus pastor and organist). The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the service.

Pre-registration is required for all services (by Saturday noon please).

Holy Week begins March 28. Maundy Thursday is April 1st; Good Friday is April 2nd. A Maundy Thursday service will be at Grace on Holy Wednesday (March 31) in addition to one on April 1st at St. Matthew's. A second Good Friday service is planned for St. Matthew's at 3:00 p.m. in addition to the 9:30 a.m. service (if needed); a second Good Friday service will be provided at Grace if needed. Please let Pastor Wood know asap if you are wanting to attend Maundy Thursday and/or Good Friday services, as well as Easter service (additional services will be provided if necessary).

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT FORMULA OF CONCORD, EPITOME ARTICLE VII, THE HOLY SUPPER OF CHRIST

We believe, teach, and confess that not only the true believers in Christ and the worthy, but also the unworthy and unbelievers receive Christ's true body and blood. However, they do not receive them for life and consolation, but for judgment and condemnation, if they are not converted and do not repent (1 Corinthians 11:27–29).

We believe, teach, and confess also that there is only one kind of unworthy guests: those who do not believe. About these guests it is written in John 3:18, "Whoever does not believe is condemned already." And this judgment becomes greater and more grievous, being aggravated by the unworthy use of the Holy Supper (1 Corinthians 11:29).

We believe, teach, and confess that no true believer—as long as he has living faith, however weak he may be—receives the Holy Supper to his judgment. For the Supper was instituted especially for Christians weak in faith, yet repentant. It was instituted for their consolation and to strengthen their weak faith [Matthew 9:12; 11:5, 28].

We believe, teach, and confess that all the worthiness of guests of this heavenly feast is and is founded on Christ's most holy obedience and perfect merit alone. We receive these for ourselves by true faith, and by the Sacrament we are assured of them. Our worthiness is not at all in our virtues or preparations. (paragraphs 16, 18-20)


