The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

The Theme for the 2021 Lenten Midweek Services is "Four Significant Days." Our Lenten journey continues on Wednesday at St. Matthew's at 7:30 P.M. (MB) and will also be live-streamed. Pre-registration, non-medical masks etc. will be required. All other Covid-19 precautions will be observed.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!'" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) Under the provincial health guidelines we are allowed to have 25% capacity (55 people) at St. Matthew's. The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the service. There will be one service at St. Matthew's: 9:30 A.M. (MB). A second service at 1:15 P.M. (MB) will be added if needed.

Divine Service at Grace is limited to 30% (30 persons plus pastor and organist). The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the service.

Pre-registration is required for all services (by Saturday noon MB time please).

Holy Week begins March 28. Maundy Thursday is April 1st; Good Friday is April 2nd. A Maundy Thursday service will be at Grace on Holy Wednesday (March 31) in addition to one on April 1st at St. Matthew's. A second Good Friday service is planned for St. Matthew's at 3:00 p.m. in addition to the 9:30 a.m. service (if needed); a second Good Friday service will be provided at Grace if needed. Please let Pastor Wood know no later than March 27 if you are wanting to attend Maundy Thursday and/or Good Friday services, as well as Easter service. This will allow opportunity to announce any extra services if needed.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT APOLOGY OF THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION, ARTICLE V, LOVE AND FULFILLING THE LAW

We will reply to those passages that the adversaries quote in order to prove that we are justified by love and works. They quote 1 Corinthians 13:2, "If I have all faith ... but have not love, I am nothing." Paul testifies to the entire Church (they say) that faith alone does not justify. This passage of Paul requires love. We also require this. For we have said that renewal and beginning to fulfill the Law must exist in us, according to Jeremiah 31:33, "I will put My law within them, and I will write it on their hearts." If anyone should cast away love, even though he has great faith, he does not keep his faith, for he does not keep the Holy Spirit. In this passage Paul does not talk about the way of justification. Instead, he writes to those who, after they had been justified, should be urged to bring forth good fruit lest they lose the Holy Spirit. They quote this one passage, in which teaches about fruit [of faith]. Yet they leave out many other passages in which he discusses the way of justification. Besides, they add a correction to the passages that speak of faith, namely, that the passages ought to be understood as applying to "faith formed by love." They add no correction that there is also need for faith, which believes we are counted righteous for Christ's sake as the Atonement. The adversaries exclude Christ from justification and teach only a righteousness of the Law. (paragraphs 97-100)


