Holy Communion is celebrated today.

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted

by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

"I was glad when they said to me, 'Let us go to the house of the LORD!" (Psalm 122:1 ESV) Under the provincial health guidelines there will be no in-person service at St. Matthew's until at least May 30th.

Private Communion will be available by appointment during the week.

Divine Service at Grace is limited to 30 (30 persons plus pastor and organist). The use of non-medical masks will be required by all attending the service.

Pre-registration is required for all services (by Saturday noon MB time please).

Information from LCMS on the covid vaccines is available on the information table in the narthex. This document presents information on vaccines with ethical concerns. If faced with no choice in vaccine and having to receive a vaccine with ethical concerns, consider this from Martin Luther (though not in the same context at all): "Sin boldly, but trust Christ more boldly." Pastor Wood is available to discuss any concerns you might have on this matter.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER APOLOGY OF THE AUGSBURG CONFESSION ARTICLE XIIA, REPENTANCE

Our adversaries cry out that they are the Church, that they are following the general agreement of the Church. But Peter cites here in our issue the consensus of the Church, "To Him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins" (Acts 10:43). The general agreement of the prophets is certainly to be judged as the general agreement of the Church universal... By our adversaries decrees they not only condemn the doctrine that we obtain the forgiveness of SINS through faith (not on account of our works, but because of Christ)... Therefore, let us not hesitate to use this saying of Peter, which summarizes the Prophets. The Holy Spirit's testimony is added to this statement of Peter. For the text speaks this way, "While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word" (Acts 10:44). Therefore, let godly consciences know that God's command is this: They are to believe that they are freely forgiven for Christ's sake, and not for the sake of our works. Let them sustain themselves against despair and against the terrors of sin and of death by this command of God. Let them know that this belief has existed among saints from the beginning of the world. For Peter clearly cites the general agreement of the Prophets, and the writings of the apostles confirm that they believe the same thing. (paragraphs 66-67, 70-73)


