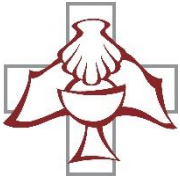

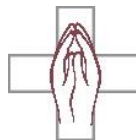

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Please mark the registration sheet for communion and worship attendance in the narthex. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

ALL SAINTS DAY (Observed)

FORMULA OF CONCORD, SOLID DECLARATION

ARTICLE XI, GOD'S ETERNAL ELECTION

If we want to think about our eternal election to salvation helpfully, we must in every way hold firmly to this truth: just as the preaching of repentance is universal, so also the promise of the Gospel is universal, that is, it belongs to all people. For this reason Christ has given these commands:

- Repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in His name to all nations. (Luke 24:47)
- God loved the world...He gave His only Son. (John 3:16)
- Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world! (John 1:29)
- [Jesus] is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. (1 John 2:2)
- The Lord is not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. (2 Peter 3:9)
- The same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing His riches on all who call on Him. (Romans 10:12)
- The righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ [is] for all who believe. (Romans 3:22)
- My Father wills that everyone who looks on the Son and believes in Him should have eternal life. (John 6:40)

It is Christ's command that this promise of the Gospel also should be offered to everyone in common to whom repentance is preached (Luke 24:47; Mark 16:15). (paragraph 28)

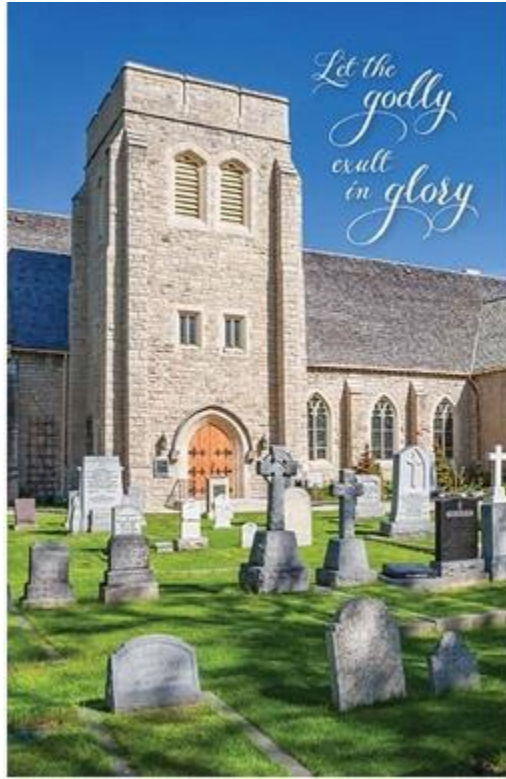
