The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is

present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

"O LORD, I love the habitation of your house and the place where your glory dwells" (Psalm 26:8 ESV) Under the new health orders St. Matthew's is limited to 25 or 33% capacity whichever is greater (approximately 68 persons depending on seating). We will NOT be requiring a proof of vaccination to attend service.

The use of non-medical masks is required.

Pre-registration is requested (by Saturday noon MB time please).

TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST LARGE CATECHISM. TEN COMMANDMENTS

Those fussy spirits are to be rebuked who, after they have heard a sermon or two, find hearing more sermons to be tedious and dull. They think that they know all well enough and need no more instruction. For that is exactly the sin that was previously counted among mortal sins and is called apathy. This is a malignant, dangerous plague with which the devil deceives the hearts of many so that he may surprise us and secretly take God's Word from us.

Even though you know God's Word perfectly: you are daily in the devil's kingdom. He ceases neither day nor night to kindle in your heart unbelief and wicked thoughts against the commandments. You must always have God's Word in your heart, upon your lips, and in your ears. But where the heart is idle and the Word does not make a sound, the devil breaks in and has done the damage before we are aware. On the other hand, the Word is so effective that whenever it is seriously contemplated, heard, and used, it is bound never to be without fruit. It always awakens new understanding, pleasure, and devoutness and produces a pure heart and pure thoughts. For these words are not dead, but are creative, living words [Hebrews 4:12]. This truth ought to urge everyone to the Word, because thereby the devil is driven away. Besides, this commandment is fulfilled and this exercise in the Word is more pleasing to God than any work of, however brilliant.(paragraphs 99-102)


