### Holy Communion is celebrated today.

The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is

present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded.

"O LORD, I love the habitation of your house and the place where your glory dwells" (Psalm 26:8 ESV) Under the new health orders St. Matthew's is limited to 25 or 33% capacity whichever is greater (approximately 68 persons depending on seating). We will NOT be requiring a proof of vaccination to attend service.

The use of non-medical masks is required.

Pre-registration is requested (by Saturday noon MB time please).

### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD

TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST LARGE CATECHISM, THE LORD'S PRAYER

God wishes for us to pray to Him for all the things that affect our bodily interests, so that we seek and expect help nowhere else except in Him. But He has put this matter last. For if we are to be preserved and delivered from all evil, God's name must first be hallowed in us, His kingdom must be with us, and His will must be done. After that He will finally preserve us from sin and shame, and, besides, from everything that may hurt or harm us.

So God has briefly placed before us all the distress that may ever come upon us, so that we might have no excuse whatever for not praying. But all depends upon this, that we learn also to say "Amen." This means that we do not doubt that our prayer is surely heard and that what we pray shall be done. This is nothing else than the word of undoubting faith, which does not pray on a dare but knows that God does not lie to him. For He has promised to grant it. Therefore, where there is no such faith, there cannot be true prayer either.

It is, therefore, an evil deception on those who pray as though they could not dare from the heart to say "Yes!" and positively conclude that God hears them. Instead, they remain in doubt and say, "How can I be so bold as to boast that God hears my prayer? For I am but a poor sinner." The reason for this is, they do not respect God's promise, but they rely on their own worthiness... (paragraphs 117-122)


