The Sacrament of the Altar is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, for us Christians to eat and to drink, instituted by Christ Himself. Jesus Christ is

present in the sacrament by His Word and we receive His gifts through faith for the assurance of the forgiveness of our sins and for strength to live new life in Him.

Our practice of closed communion is the historic practice of the church. It is prompted by love, both for God's Word and God's people. It does not deny that members of other denominations are Christians. Rather, it acknowledges God's deep concern for doctrinal truth (Rom. 16:17) and the Bible's witness that doctrinal unity is central to the common reception of this sacrament.

For this reason, guests who desire to commune are asked to speak with the pastor before the service.

Advance registration for this service today is also registration for communion. In the interim the use of communion registration cards will be suspended and have been removed from the pews.

Those who are not yet confirmed are welcome to come to receive a blessing, but are asked to keep their hands folded. "O LORD, I love the habitation of your house and the place where your glory dwells" (Psalm 26:8 ESV) Under the new health orders St. Matthew's is limited to 150 or 50% capacity whichever is greater (approximately 68 persons depending on seating).

The use of non-medical masks is again required Pre-registration is requested (by Saturday noon MB time please).

Divine Service at Grace: The use of non-medical masks is again required. In Christian freedom please continue to respect others' desire for physical distancing when entering/exiting and being seated.

Be mindful that not all may be vaccinated or fully vaccinated. It is still possible for fully vaccinated individuals to contract Covid-19 and also transmit it to others.

Pastor Wood has been asked to serve Zion, Yorkton as vacancy pastor and to serve as vacancy pastor (on call basis) for Hope, Grandview.

Pastor Wood will be taking a week's vacation beginning after service today (September 19-27). There will not be services on September 26th. Divine Services will resume on October 3rd.

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF CONCORD SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST LARGE CATECHISM, PART IV, BAPTISM

The objection of the sectarians is empty. Even though infants did not believe (which, however, is not the case), still their Baptism would be valid. No one should rebaptize infants. Nothing is taken away from the Sacrament even though someone approaches it with evil purpose. So he could not be allowed to take it a second time the self-same hour on account of his abuse, as though he had not received the true Sacrament at first. That would blaspheme and profane the Sacrament in the worst way. How dare we think that God's Word and ordinance should be wrong and invalid because we make a wrong use of it?

If you did not believe then, believe now and say this: The Baptism certainly was right. But I, unfortunately, did not receive it aright. All who are baptized, must say this before God, "I come here in my faith. Yet I cannot rest in this, that I believe, and that many people pray for me. But in this I rest, that Baptism is Your Word and command. It is just like when I go to the Sacrament trusting not in my faith, but in Christ's Word. Whether I am strong or weak, I commit that to God. But I know this, that He asks me to go, to eat and to drink, and He gives me His body and blood. That will not deceive me or prove false to me."

So likewise in infant Baptism we bring the child solely because of God's command because we know that God does not lie. God's Word cannot err. (paragraphs 55-57)


